

Déjà What?

The term **déjà vu** is French and means, literally, "already seen." Those who have experienced the feeling describe it as an overwhelming sense of familiarity with something that shouldn't be familiar at all. Say, for example, you are traveling to England for the first time. You are touring a cathedral, and suddenly it seems as if you have been in that very spot before. Or maybe you are having dinner with a group of friends, discussing some current movie star, and you have the feeling that you've already experienced this very thing -- same friends, same dinner, same topic.
